Step I: Say something positive about your students.


Step II: Tell your students what needs to be improved or changed.

Stacy : I think you are an honest person. When you don't like something, you just say it.


Carl : You do not write about environmental problems often enough, but you should. It is a very serious problem.

Whose comments are related to Amy's personal characteristics?


